DISTRICT 09 GSR MEETING MARCH 3, 2023 OCONTO, WI

Mary talked about a gathering at the Potawatomi/Carter. There is an upfront cost, but if you leave it clean you will be reimbursed. Mary said she may have nine people interested in planning. She is working to get help.

Started without introduction, jumped into: Carol (PI) and "I am Responsible" /service workshop event update. The committee (Jolene, Janet, Bill, Mary) prior to the district meeting. Since the District is so big, the plan is to hold two events, one in Spring and one in Fall. Each event would be a half day event and the point would be how to get people involved in service. The committee agreed that Bill from the Area would be invited to the next meeting (April 7 1pm Wausaukee) and the format would include overview of service, panel discussion, and breakout of meet and greet. The location of the first event is likely in Oconto and the committee is talking to Mike regarding available dates of the Church. We will need committees to plan food, agenda, finance, and communication. Anyone who would like to be involved in the committee please contact any of the committee members.

Mary **Opened the meeting** with the Serenity Prayer. Introductions: Mary C Townsend; Bob, Gerald, Dar, Mike, Ross, Karen Oconto; Carol P Marinette; Bill, Jim, Olivia Shawano; Paul Suring; Jolene Coleman; Janet Menominee.

Secretary Report Carol P – Standing in for Sara – Jolene approved the minutes from the last meeting and seconded by Jim. Meeting Update, hunger of service work.

Treasurer Report – treasurer Dan L not in attendance, Paul spoke on behalf of Dan who called Paul at noon unable to attend. Paul said we need to approve or correct the treasure detail as stated in The Chronicle. Jim made a motion to approve the Treasure Report and Carol P seconded. Unanimous acceptance. Mary did not see the report. Paul's meeting share: Thursday Night meeting, 6:30 "only Church on Main Street" started as Big Book Study, spotty attendance, but have restarted 4-5 folks. Old timer says to take your time with the big book. May only study a few sentences. Slow learn on the Big Book.

Archives Report – Ross: One new thing to report. Found a proper 3rd addition dust jacket for 1st printing of the 3rd addition Big Book in the archives. Cost of fifty cents. Ross's GSR update: they

have had a few new people at the Sunday Night Big Book in Shawano hoping they keep coming back. Also, if you need the Archives at an event, he is willing to set up a display anytime.

Grapevine Report– Mike nothing new. If you have an event and would like Grapevine display, please let him know. Mike is the GSR for 3 meetings in Oconto. 10 people Monday and 6-7 on Wednesday. Getting new faces and they are coming back. There is a meeting by Brothers Three recovery meeting. They are starting a Big Book meeting on Saturday. 7pm Wednesday night Gerald filled in information. Gerald GSR Oconto - for Monday Big Book Oconto 7pm. Saturday they are starting Joe & Charlie Meeting. Just getting started up and they would like to have games.

Newsletter Report—Jolene nothing new. She has a question to Janet regarding Janet to submit an article for April Chronicle about Corrections, Janet agreed. Mary asked about posting anniversaries. Mary does not like the idea, but Mary is asking the groups. It was approved last month to publish sobriety dates. Jolene stated as an Alternate GSR for the Monday night group, she passed around a piece of paper that give people to opportunity to have the anniversary date published in The Chronicle. It is voluntary. She asked that other GSRs do the same. If people want their sobriety date to be published in The Chronicle, it is their option. Email list to Jolene. She will start publishing in April. She needs help with the list and maintaining the list. Paul added maintenance of the list was done by Brian B in the past and he may be interested in helping Jolene maintain the list.

Corrections Report – Janet contacted Paul about John N in Crivitz/Wausaukee about going to jail cells in Marinette and Menominee. Janet met a gentleman in Wausaukee that would like to step down. There is a need for someone to carry it on, he is elderly. Janet is waiting for a response from James. Need contact for Shawano, anyone going to Shawano jails? Per Bill Charlie and Justin one of counselors there. Janet asked if there is anyone for the women? Janet announced the Moose & Goose April 13th Seymour. Janet & Yvonne went to the Marinette Jail last Tuesday where there were 6-7 women. Yvonne is trying to open AA to the Menominee Jail but had no luck. GSR update: 16 people at women's meeting. Mary will be speaking at the Women's 5:30 tomorrow. Mary found a booklet by AA on how to speak to the public. Jolene asked if there was a flyer for the Moose & Goose yet. None yet as of today.

Public Information Report – Carol passed around cards to post to carry the message. Paul did ask about the cost. We have gone through 400 and PI has had member contributions to pay for the cost of the business parts. Paul would like more. He has had good experience and feedback.

Treatment Report – Dee not in attendance

Website Report – Todd not in attendance, sent in his report. We have 43 meetings listed on the website. Added 3-day meeting in Shawano. Updated the website event page. Updated contact page. Worked with Dan L to set the website committee budget. We have been spending \$298.92 /YR.

Alternate DCM Report – Jim H Shawano has had an influx of mature folks attending their midday meetings. Might want to make sure towns have a midday meeting for the older population. The meeting at the Presbyterian Church is at 11am. The Recovery center closed. Trying to open a meeting at Hope Church.

Karen – Attends Bill/Bob meeting. Trying to get another meeting at Hope Church 9am Monday through Friday.

Olivia – Women's meeting on Tuesday at 6:30 is moving to the Presbyterian Church. I was attending the Bill/Bob at Recovery Center. Then they split. Olivia is the GSR. (Yeah) has been attending. There are at least 10 people. The Recovery Center is a bit sketchy. Olivia would like to see an Alano Club in the area. Olivia is trying to learn more about meetings and Alano Clubs. Mary asked if Olivia is registered as a GSR for her meeting. They will meet after the meeting.

Bob- Back after long relapse, currently meeting in Oconto. When he was looking for a meeting, he struggled to find a meeting in Oconto. Found a flyer at the laundromat. Looking for district help for the still struggling alcoholics.

Mary- talked about her meeting District 10.

Dar – Mike's backup. Oconto Wednesday is her home group from 10-11. Average of 6-12 folks.

Carol- Update 3 grapevine stories displayed at the Alano Club.

Old Business: Flyer. Janet emailed Area 74 District 09 Michigan Corrections and is looking for Michigan Chair. Paul – There are two corrections chairs for the Area. One for Wisconsin, one for Michigan. If the district has a question of the Area Corrections, it will depend on the state as to where to direct the questions. This confirms Janet's point about the fact that the Area is looking for someone to fill the Area's Michigan Corrections Chair. Mary – Talked about Johnnie and there have been 70 translations of the Big Book. Plain Language Big Book in process. One fella thinks women should be in the kitchen. New Group Listing form for Olivia.

New Business: Carol – was there any update from yesterday's meeting? Paul – Yes there was an update. Tonight, we will be receiving a lengthy email from our delegate, Nicholas. He is preparing for the General Service Conference. Everyone should take back to the groups. It is Mary's job to disseminate the information to the GSR and to gather the information back from The GSRs. That is the DCM's job to report back by 30th of March. The information is digital, does not have to be distributed manually, it can be emailed. Mary asked about expectations and the fact that emails will be key. We passed around a list of emails. Jolene asked when the GSRs can expect the email tonight? Paul said they are hoping it comes out tonight. Mary said it may take a couple of days. Carol – just to clarify, we get the emails then we need to ask the rooms and we need to get back to you prior to the next district meeting, right? Are we going to overload Mary? There will be 14 emails from GSR. Jolene – our Delegate is preparing a survey. Paul – there are two different things. The Survey contact will happen after the delegate goes to GSO. But the annual conference is coming up in mid-April, so there is not much time to work on it. Paul suggests once they are disseminated, just pick out a few things. No need to get too detailed about it. We are not expected to go through all the details. If there are "hot button" issues, make that judgement call. It is a good conversation topic. Any feedback that gets back to Mary will go to the Delegate. Mary – conversation regarding Area Budget for Delegate.

There are other committees at the Area level, like: Literature, Archives, Corrections, Grapevine, and Treatment. PI's focus is:

- Giving presentations about A.A to schools and organizations.
- Providing information about A.A. through digital and print materials.
- Ensuring local media have accurate information about A.A. through PSAs, anonymity-protected interviews, and press kits.

One of the actions we have taken is to make available a business size card, that states:

If you want to drink that's **your** business.

If you want to quit that's **our** business.

Our Principle of Humility

In our literature, *Came to Believe*..., there is a story titled "A Lesson in Humility". A member shared, they were asked to give a few words at their church and while preparing these words they developed into a sermon. The member talks of how people will really enjoy hearing what they have to say. When the time came to talk, the member recounts being unable to share due to an incredible thirst. The member writes,

"God was telling me, 'You are an alcoholic. That is all you are. Not a preacher, not a teacher, not a speaker. Just an alcoholic, recovering by My grace.' And that was that. A lesson taught with humor. A lesson I must never forget: The important thing is not what I do or where I live or what my name is; the important thing is that I am a recovering alcoholic, by the grace of God, through membership in A.A." (p. 113).

For years I let my pride and ego get in the way of being connected with others in the world and with God. I either had to be the best or suffer the worst. There was no middle ground that is necessary for change or progress. My ego persisted when I could not take a compliment or believed my feelings were more important than someone else's. My pride flourished when I took criticism at work poorly, was fearful to ask for any sort of help, or, even in sobriety, wanted to have the best share at a meeting.

With practice of contrary action, guidance from a sponsor, and faith in a Higher Power, I can overcome my defects and find the peace that comes with humility. When I receive a compliment, I can respond with a simple thank you. During conflict I can listen to understand. At work, I welcome criticism so I can develop new skills. I have faith asking for help is a sign of strength. In meetings, I only share what I know to be true and works in my life through my experience, my strength, and my hope. Humility is to be one of many people. When I accept I am no different but just am, the world hums freely around me and those conscious contacts with God come more often. In all these things, I trust I am doing God-pleasing action which is all this drunk can ask for.
