

Tips for sharing about the 2025 International Convention event!

January 10, 2025

What each attendee can expect to do?

Take part in the:

- Thursday night party, flag ceremony, the stadium meetings and the Saturday night old timers' meeting.
- Over 20+ Hospitality suites, collecting pins and how some people bring some to trade or share.
- Over 250 different meetings to pick from. The types of meetings that take place are clergy panels, international, and of course, A.A. topic related. There are marathon meetings overnight for those who can sleep after the convention is over!
- · Grapevine is onsite, we have a carry the message pavilion and the infamous GSO archives display.

The Saturday night old timer's meeting is so special, A.A. member attendees with a certain number of years of sobriety, usually around 50+, sign up starting on Thursday. Then, Saturday night, all those attendees who signed up sit together and random names are drawn for them to come up to the Stadium Podium and share for about 8 minutes how they have stayed sober. Amazing shares ensue, as you can imagine.

We understand many have never experienced an International Convention. With 10 years since the last convention, we have lost a lot of knowledge about what to expect, people think it is like their local round-up or state convention. **NO.** This is the chance to hear from non-alcoholic professionals directly, international attendees, archives display – the things you don't get at other events.

The clock is ticking towards the 2025 International Convention in Vancouver, British Columbia start date on July 3, 2025, through July 6, 2025, and there is so much excitement to share.

The latest monthly Archives Committee meeting discussion centered around our desire for a permanent repository for Area 74 archives materials. Currently the materials are in possession of our Archivist, Jeffery E., and stored in his basement office and garage. The materials when moved to this location required two full pick-up truck loads. There are 20 some totes, laptop, scanner, displays and other miscellaneous items. The ability to access and research the collection leaves a bit to be desired due to limited space. The goal that we had discussed when this rotation began was to digitize what we could and purge items that were not pertinent to the Area. Some things belong to the districts and others are so common that we don't need to keep them in our collection.

When I attended the 2024 NAAAW, I felt a need to make our history more accessible to our Area. I saw examples of how other Areas and Districts did things. There are much better ways than tasking the Archivist with maintaining our collection until the next rotation. We have some very interesting materials and they need to be shared with more than an occasional conference.

The dark side of not having a permanent home for Archives also came to light. One group lost their entire archives when the Archivist simply disappeared from AA. Another group's Archivist passed away and when some group members went to retrieve the collection, the family claimed they inherited the material but were willing to sell it to the group. I listened to several other stories that illustrated the drawbacks of Archives being personally maintained by an Archivist.

I hope that issues of accessibility and security are enough to establish a need for this action. Let's talk about a solution. First, a conditioned space that is secure is required. A quick check revealed rental units in the Area cost about \$100/month and would be heated and lockable. A unit would be between 50-70 square feet in size, which is enough to hold everything we have. We would have to sort and remove items as needed and return them appropriately.

This Summer we displayed our Archives at Wausau's Alano Club to help celebrate their 50th anniversary. At a display close by, St Anthony Spirituality Center was represented by their Spiritual Director. The next display was staffed by our DCM from the district that includes Wausau. And with the Area Archives Chair grouped in one corner, we progressed into one rather long AA meeting. This resulted in an invitation to St Anthony's with the purpose of seeing if our vision of a repository could become a reality with their help. The building in question is somewhat centrally located in the Area. At 300 E. Fourth Street in Marathon, Wisconsin (see sarcenter.com), so the UP would get shorted a bit on proximity as would the far northern districts in WI. We consider the location to be a strong "pretty good". The building was built in 1919 and added onto in the 1960s. This historic structure is built like a fortress, and it is beautiful. It is extremely well maintained.

During our inspection visit, Jeffery and I asked lots of questions. The space would be ideal with many rooms available for use. There are AA meetings on the premises, weekend spirituality workshops with onsite lodging for up to 80 guests, 24-hour onsite security, internet access and beautiful grounds for relaxation and meditation. The place would be ideal for sorting and digitizing materials, having day long or several day workshops, or doing personal research. Per 7th Tradition, we would pay a monthly rental fee for our use. The amount is to be negotiated with the Director at St Anthony's. Their board would review our situation and respond when we give them our proposal. During our visit, Jeffery had his phone recording many things that would possibly work into a usable space, I kept my tape measure busy checking to see if the rooms that looked good would accommodate our needs.

Every AA is part of AA history. Please share this information with DCMs so it can be discussed at District Meetings. GSRs, please discuss this with your groups so we can get an informed Group Conscience. Thank you to the Archives Committee members who met to help us talk about this action.
